

Memorandum for y<sup>e</sup> Gov<sup>r</sup> relating to the land of W<sup>m</sup> Johnson betwixt  
upland Creek & Prestons Creek that the last work Charles Ashcom  
going to Lay out Lampolet LLOYD land being 100 acres & in running the  
line he found that it wold tak in his house & Plantation into the line  
of W<sup>m</sup> Johnson yet writ: Johnson was content, to run the line so that  
the house and Plantation of s<sup>d</sup> LLOYD sh<sup>ld</sup> be left out, but s<sup>d</sup> LLOYD  
answered he wold have no land their except the line was to run  
straigh into the lane of W<sup>m</sup> Johnson  
Cha. Ashcom offered Lloyd to run out his Land next day, but Lloyd  
would refused, & so ~~the~~ came to Phila: to complain, but izant cause  
or inst reason
