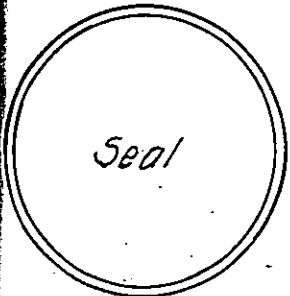

At the Request of William Jenkins of Abington That we would Grant him a Resurvey on a certain Tract of Land laid out to the s^d William in Duffein Mawr within the bounds of the Welch tract for two hundred and fifty acres in right and part of his Original purchase of 1000 Acres: These are to require thee forthwith to resurvey the s^d Tract and if the Overplus thereof doe not amount to Sixty Acres, of which quantity the s^d Williams Tract in Haverford laid out for two hundred and fifty Acres doth fall short in measure thou art hereby required to add the s^d quantity ~~to the~~ of Sixty Acres to the s^d Number of two hundred and fifty Acres of the Land adjoyning if so much can be had, or of good ^{Vacant} Land lying nearest thereunto if convenient, and make Returns into the general Surveyors Office at Philadelphia where this Warrant is to remain and a Copy thereof to be del^{iv}d to thee certified by the Secretary. ~~and~~ Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philad^{ia} the ninth of November 1702
