near Delaware—as may be. These are in ye Proprietarys name to will & require  
thee forthw<sup>th</sup> to survey or cause to be surveyd unto him a Lott to ye Westward of  
John Bolt on ye back of High Street, he fencing it in & building upon ye same w<sup>th</sup> in  
six months after ye date of survey according to regulation, & make returns thereof  
into ye Secretarys office. Given at Philadelphia, ye 13<sup>th</sup> <sup>11<sup>th</sup></sup>/<sub>1710</sub>. 1684.
