At the request of Joseph Tucker of Abington that we would grant him to take up at Oley in the County of Philad^a the quantity of two hundred acres of land for which he agrees to pay to the use of the Trustees eight & twenty pounds money of Pensilv^a for the whole and the yearly quitrent of one shilling Sterling for each hundred acres. These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd unto the said Joseph Tucker at the place aforesaid according to the Method of Townships the said quantity of two hundred acres of land that has not been already survey'd nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make returns thereof into ye Secretarys office in order for a further Confirmation which survey in case the said Joseph Tucker fulfill the above agreement within three months after ye date hereof shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted. Given under our hands & the seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 12th day of Decemb^r
