



Whereas Jo<sup>seph</sup> Tizacke Purchased of ye Proprietor Two Thousand acres of land ye Liberty land whereoff by Lott fall on ye west side of ye Skoolkill, and haveing sett up a saw mill and intending to build other mills on ye east side of ye sd Creek w<sup>ch</sup> will be of great service to ye publick and in order to carry on and Incourage him in his designs, at his request wee have granted him Thirty two acres of liberty land lying on ye eastward side of ye Skoolkill about ye falls as convenient as possible for a landing to his aforesaid Improvern<sup>ts</sup>

These are therefore in ye Proprietarys name to will and require thee forthwith to survey or cause to be surveyd unto him ye said land and make returne thereof to ye Secretarys office. Dated at Philad ye 6<sup>th</sup> day of ye 2<sup>d</sup> mo. 1689.
