

Pennsylvania

By virtue of a warrant from ye Com^{rs} dated ye 24 of ye 11 mo 1691 directed to ye Survey^r Generall I do by authority ffrom him certifie into ye Secretaryes office that there was surveyed and laid out ye same day unto Robert Turner Eighty five acres of land part of ye overplus of Shakamaxonck 10 acres, whereof is Cripple and Broken lands and is bounded to the south with ye new bridge over Pohocksink Creek to ye north and northeast with ye said Creek and to ye westward with ye fast land formerly belonging to Andrew Salong. The remaining eighty five acres, being part fast land and part broken and Criples, Begineth at a corne^r of Sam^l Carpenters land ffrom thence southeast by ye same two hundred ffourty ffour perches to a corne^r post standing by Gunnors Creek, ffrom thence following downe the severall courses there of to ye river delaware, ffrom thence along ye same to a Corne^r post of Thomas ffairmans ffrom thence N.N.W by ye said ffairmans land two hundred ffourty seven perches ffrom thence ENE eight perches thence N 26^d Wly ffourty eight perches, thence W.S.W ffour perches ffrom thence N.N.W twenty ffour perches to ye place of beginning. Containing in beath ye said tracts ninty ffive acres of land which is accordingly entred and recorded in ye Survey^r Generals office at Philadelphia. Lt. Longshore. dep^y Surv^r Gen^l
