 from the Prop<sup>ty</sup> & Gov<sup>t</sup> dated ye 6<sup>th</sup> of the 4<sup>th</sup> mo<sup>th</sup> <sup>1684</sup> unto Richard Thomas  
 a Gittie lott running north eighteen degrees east by Thomas Bowmans lott  
 three hundred and six foot, Thence south seventie two degrees east by vac<sup>t</sup> lotts  
 one hundred thirtie two foot, thence south eighteen degrees west by a vacant lott  
 three hundred & six foot, thence north seventie two degrees west by high street  
 one hundred thirtie two foot, Returned according to which abovesaid survey  
 and bounds into ye proprietaries Secretaries office the tenth day of ye fifth mo<sup>th</sup>  
 1684.

The above is a true copie of ye return of ye sd lott as it stands recorded in ye book  
 of records of returns of lotts & lands in the survey<sup>r</sup> Generalls office examined &  
 Compared this 1<sup>st</sup> March 1696 by, Pat. Robinson Survey

Bounded on the south w<sup>th</sup> the High Street one west w<sup>th</sup> Tho. Bowmans lott on  
 the north with back lotts, and on the east with a vacant lott.
