At the request of Joseph Tanner by his Attorney Nathaniel Puckle That I would
grant him to take up Three hundred acres of land in right of an old purchase
by him made. These are to require thee forthwith to survey or cause to be sur-
veyd unto him the said number of acres of land in this Province not already
taken up, to be laid out according to the Method of townships by me ap-
pointed. And make return thereof into my Secretaries office. Given under
my hand and seal at Philadelphia the 10th day of the 5th moth 1700.
