Surveyed for Joseph Allamore 250 acres and Robert Bourroughs 50 acres being all 300 acres together not divided lying on the southside of Ridley Creek beginning at a black walnut by the sd Creekside being the corner tree of Elizabeth Jarves and running up the sd Jarves line of marked trees S. W. b. W. 330 perch to a marked white oak from thence N. W. b. N. 150 perch to a marked white oak from thence N. E. b. E. 370 perch to a marked hickory standing by Ridley Creek and from thence down the Creek on several courses to the first (obliterated) (obl.)
