These are to authorize and require thee forthwith to survey and lay out to the said Robert Asstetor the said number of five hundred ^{acres} of land in the said place if so much there be there vacant in one tract and make returns into the General Surveyors office at Philadelphia where this warrant is to remain and a copy thereof to be delivered to thee certified by the Secretary Given under our hands and the seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 1st of the 2^d moth 1702.
