At the request of Robt. Assheton. That we would grant him to take up five hundred acres of land over and above the 13.14 acres already taken up in right and further in part of the Three thousand acres granted to the Children of W^m Assheton his father by the Propriet^r in England. These are to authorize and require thee to survey and lay out in the right aforesaid & according to the Method of Townships appointed the said quantity of five hundred acres of land that has not been already survey'd nor taken up nor is concealed nor seated by the Indians and make returns into the General Surveyors office at Philadelphia where this warrant is to remain and a copy thereof deliv'd to thee certified by the Secretary. Given under our hands and seal of the Province at Philad^{ia} the 14th day of the 3^d month (May) 1706.
