These are to authorize and require thee to survey and lay out in right of the aforesaid grant five hundred acres more of land that has not been already survey'd nor taken up nor is conceal'd nor seated by the Indians. And make returns into the General Surveyors office at Philad^{ia} where this warrant is to remain and a copy thereof to be deliv'd to thee certified by the Secretary. Given under our hands and seals at Philadelphia the 4th day of the eleventh month 170^{3/4}
