Beginning at a white oak sappling at a corner of Everd Boltin^s land and extending thence by the said Boltins line south west five hundred and twenty six ^{another} fches. to a post at a corner of said Boltins land Thence north west eighty two perches to a post at Toby Leech his corner Then by a the said Leech his line north east five hundred and twenty six perches to a post Thence south east eighty two perches to the Beginning Containing two hundred and sixty nine acres.
