

By virtue of a warrant from the Commissioners of Property bearing date ye 9th of 8^{br} 1704 for surveying unto Joseph Fisher 1000^o of land in the Proprietaries manner of Gilberts for which he is to pay unto the Proprietaries Use two hundred and thirty five ~~pounds~~ pounds. There was surveyd and laid out unto the said Joseph Fisher the said Quantity of one thousand acres in the said manner Beginning at a Birch tree by Schuylkil River by a Dry hollow Vale above Perqueorminck Creek and extending thence east five degrees north twenty eight Poles to a white oak Thence north east by east three hundred and forty perches to a Maple tree by the said Perqueorminck Creek thence up the said Creek on several Courses four hundred & sixty perches to a post Thence south west five hundred and forty perches to a Hickry tree by Schuylkil Then down the said River on several Courses three hundred and ten perches to the Beginning.
