These are therefore in the Proprietors name to will and require thee fforthwith to survey or Lay out ~~to him~~ or cause to be laid out, to ~~Nathl Allen~~ <sup>to him</sup> thirty ffoot of ye said bank beginning at ye north side of Phil Richardses Lott ~~and~~ continuing that breadth ffrom thence northwardly along ye bank side to the said Nath Allen forthwith securing ye bank, and with all convenient speed building and wharfing out according to ye Proprs regulation and make returne hereof to ye Secretarys office
