His Honour The Governour has (at the request of Richard Peters Esq^r in Behalf of his Brother, and the Creditors of Daniel Clarke) directed me to write to thee to resurvey or otherwise ascertain, the quantity, bounds[&] Limits, of those five tracts of land formerly surveyed for Richard Hookley Esquire on his warrants dated the 10th of July 1762, by running round the same, and marking them afresh, according to the old lines and first bounds thereof, Taking with thee to thy assistance any persons that are capable of shewing the said Lands, as first run out.
