William Penn, Absolute Proprietary and Governour in Chief of
the Province of Pensilvania and Counties Annexed.

At the Request of Daniel Falkner, Agent for the German Company of
Purchasers, That I would Grant him to take up Twenty Two Thousand and
Twenty five Acres of Land in One Tract in This province in Right of their
first purchase made of mee in Germany. These are to Require thee
forthwith to Survey or Cause to be Surveyed to the said German purch-
asers the said number of Twenty Two thousand and Twenty Five Acres
in One Tract fronting The River Schuylkill on the North Side there of
the Breadth of about six hundred perches beginning at a Small Gutt
or Runn - about one hundred Perches on this Side of Manatawny Creek
& Extending backward Wedgewise a Sufficient Space to Contain the said
Number of Acres to be Seated & Improved according to Regulation of
which make due Returns into my Secretarys Office. Given under my
hand and Seale at Philadelphia the 26th of 7^{br} 1701.
