These are to Require thee forthwith to Survey or cause to be Survey'd  
unto David Jones late of Merioneth shire in Wales Two hundred and  
fifty Acres of my Land on the West Side of Skuyllkill within the  
Bounds of the Liberties of Philadelphia to be bounded to the  
~~North~~ ward with the Land Seated by Hugh Roberts, to the Northward  
with Will<sup>m</sup> Edwards. to the Southw<sup>d</sup> with a line to be runn par-  
allel to the Line of William Warner at the distance of twe-  
nty perches from the same and to the Westw<sup>d</sup> with my  
Vacant Land. Reserving fifty Acres on the Northeast Cor-  
ner adjacent to Jonathan Wynne and Hugh Roberts, and  
Make Returns there of into my Secretaries Office.
