 or cause to be surveyed unto him y<sup>e</sup> sd Land in ye Liberties & Land in  
 ye afore sd County where not already taken according to ye Method  
 of Townshipp's, he seating & improveing ye Land in afore sd County  
 & improveing ye Liberty Land according to regulation and make re-  
 turns there of into ye Govern<sup>r<sup>s</sup></sup> Secretary's Office. Given at Philadel-
