ladelphia as near to ye River as may be. These are to will and  
require thee forth w<sup>th</sup> to survey or cause to be survey'd unto him  
ye sd Number of Acres as convenient as may be where not already  
taken up according to ye Method of Township appointed by ye Pro-  
prietary & Govern<sup>r</sup>; he seating & improving ye same w<sup>th</sup> in six Mo-  
nths from the Date of Survey & make returns thereof into ye  
Secretary's Office. Given at Philadelphia ye 12<sup>th</sup> of ye 7<sup>th</sup> mo. 1684.
