At the Request of Thomas Dell That we would Grant him to take up five Hundred Acres of Land Purchased by his father Thomas Dell ^{now} of Kensington in y^e County of Middx Yeoman. by Deeds dated the eleventh and twelfth day of Octob^r. 1681 and by Deeds dated y^e 13th & 14th days of Septemb^r 1711 Granted by the Said father to his said Son. These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Surveyed to the said Thomas Dell (the younger) according to the method of Townships appointed the Said quantity of five Hundred acres of Land in this Province that has not been already Survey'd nor appointed nor is seated by the Indians. and make Returns thereof into the Secretaries Office. Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the eighth day of the first Month A.D. 1712.
