At the Request of John Simcock That I would grant him to
take up one hundred Acres of Land in the Liberties of the City of
Philadelphia being his Proportion of five thousand Acres in the Same
formerly granted to him on the back of William Warners Land
on Skuykil (where not already taken up) by a Warr^t under my hand
and Seal bearing date the 13th of 7^{br} 1683. These are to require
thee forthwith to Survey or cause to be survey'd unto him in ye
S^d place if not taken up or as near as Conveniently may be
where not taken up the Said Number of one hundred Acres,
He taking out a Patent for the Same within three months
after thou shall make Returns thereof into my Secretaries
Office, which thou art hereby required to doe with all convenient
Speed. Given under my hand and Seal at Philad^{ia} the 1st day of
ye 11th Moth 1700
