At the Request of Abel Strettell of Dublin in the Kingdom of Ireland by his Attorney Thomas Hutton that We would Grant him to take up Quantity of three Hundred Acres of Land further in part of the Original purchase of five Thousand Acres made of the late Proprietary William Penn Esq^r by George Shore of Athlone in the said Kingdom the Right where of being Vested in the Said Abel Strettell. These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd in Right of the said purchase. according to the Method of Townships appointed the said Quantity of three Hundred Acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Return thereof into the Secretarys Office in Order for a further Confirmation Given under our Hands and the lesser Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 14th day of the third Month Anno Qin 1729.

Upon the making up the Acct of Surveys made to A. Strettell it appears there is yet 320 acres to be taken up to compleat his rights —

Robert Strettell the present owner has granted 100^a part thereof to Sam^l Mickle who had an order to take it up accordingly on the 9th of June 1738.
