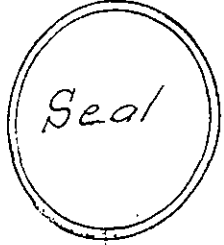

At the Request of George Smedley That I would Grant
him a Resurvey on a Tract of Land Situate in Dublin Township in the
County of Philadelphia adjoining to the Lands of Richard Hilliards
Joseph Fisher, & John Mason laid out for two hundred Acres to
John Goodin and Thomas Kitchin by vertue of ^{two former} ~~a~~ Warr^{ts} from ^{me}
^{that to Thomas Kitchin & y^e to John Goodin the 10th of the 4th month 1684 for one hundred acres}
the Proprietary, dated the 1st day of ye 8th month 1683, Now in the Posses-
^{each} sion of the S^d Geo: Smedley, one moiety thereof by Right of ye Said
Goodins Widow, the other Moiety by purchase ~~of~~ from the S^d T. Kitchin.
These are to require thee forthwith to resurvey or cause to be resur-
veyd to the Said Geo: Smedley the S^d Tract according to the true
Lines and bounds of ye former Survey and make Returns there-
of into my Secretaries Office. Given under my Hand and Seal at
Philadelphia the 16th day of the 10th Moth 1700
