At the Request of John Stille of Miamensen in the County of Philadelphia That We would Grant him a Resurvey on his Plantation in Miamensen aforesd consisting of One fourth Part of one Tract of <sup>the</sup> Last Land containing five hundred and twenty five Acres and two parcels of Meadow containing in y<sup>e</sup> whole Sixty three Acres the other three parts being held by Andrew Bankson Andrew Wheeler and <sup>W<sup>m</sup> Wells or</sup> y<sup>e</sup> Widow Nailor; These are to Authorize and Require thee forthwith to Resurvey to y<sup>e</sup> sd John the sd Plantation and Land thereunto belonging Also to lay out there with fifty Acres of Marsh granted to the sd John by y<sup>e</sup> Prop<sup>rs</sup> Warrt directed to Edwd Pennington And make Returns into y<sup>e</sup> General Surveyor's Office at Philadelphia where this Warrt is to remain and a Copy thereof to be delvd to thee certified by the Secretary.
