At the Request of Joseph Pike by his Attorney Thomas Story
That I would grant him to take up five hundred Acres of Land in
right of Sam^l Rowles old Purchaser of five Thousand Acres;
These are to require thee forthwith to Survey or cause to be survey'd
to him the said Number of Acres of Land that has not been al-
ready taken up, nor Concealed, nor cleared by the Indians, to be
laid out according to the Method of Townships by me appointed.
And make Returns thereof into my Secretaries Office, within
three Months after w^{ch} Return the S^d Jos Pike or his Attorney
is hereby required to take a Patent for the Same. Given
under my hand and Seal at Pensbury the 29th day of the
6th Moth 1700
