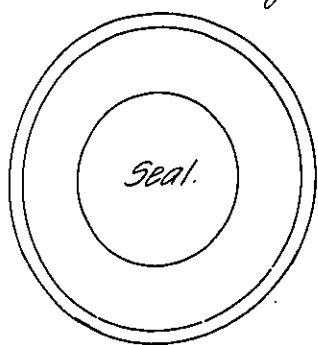


Pennsylvania Is.



By the Commissioners of Property.

At the Request of Richard Carter of the County of Chester Wheelwright that we would grant him to take up two hundred acres of land between Pecquean and Comestogoe Creeks near Susquehanna - for which he agrees to pay to the Proprietors Use twenty Pounds within three months and the yearly Quitrent of one Shilling Sterling P. hundred forever. These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd to the sd Rich<sup>d</sup> Carter the said quantity of three hundred Acres of Vacant Land between y<sup>e</sup> sd Creeks in such a manner as may not incommode any further Settlement in the parts adjacent and make a Return thereof into the Secretaries Office. Which Survey in case the sd Richard fulfill the Agreement afores<sup>d</sup> shall be valid otherwise to be void and of no effect as if it had never been made nor this Warr<sup>t</sup> ever granted. Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 22<sup>d</sup> day of the 6<sup>th</sup> Month A.D.
