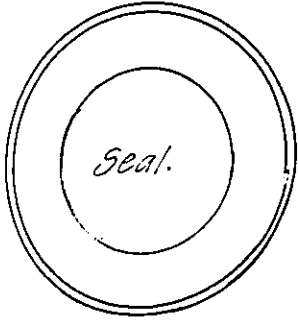


Pennsylvania

By the Commiss<sup>rs</sup> of Property

At the Request of Benjamin Chambers (in pursuance of a grant made to him by the Prop<sup>rs</sup> before his departure) we would grant him to take up for himself and Henry Green Kentish Purchasers about one hundred and fifty Acres of Land on the North Side of the Tract laid out to them and the other Kentish Purchasers near Brandywine in y<sup>e</sup> County of Chester to compensate in some measure the barrenness of the s<sup>d</sup> Tract for w<sup>ch</sup> he hath agreed to pay after y<sup>e</sup> rate of twelve pounds for every hundred Acres & so proportionally These are to Authorize thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd for the s<sup>d</sup> Benjamin- & Henry- the s<sup>d</sup> number of one hundred & fifty Acres or thereabouts in the s<sup>d</sup> place of Land not already Survey'd nor taken up nor seated by the Indians & make Returns thereof into y<sup>e</sup> Secretaries Office: Which Survey in case y<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> Benjamin upon the execution thereof fulfill his s<sup>d</sup> Agreement shall be valid otherwise shall be void & of no other effect than if y<sup>e</sup> same had never been made nor this Warr<sup>t</sup> ever granted. Given under our hands & y<sup>e</sup> Seal of the Province at Philad<sup>ia</sup> y<sup>e</sup> 31<sup>st</sup> day of 10<sup>br</sup> 1701.
