These are to will & Require thee forthw<sup>th</sup> to take care that so much Land be admeasured to him according to ye method & forme of Township which I have appointed in such cases & make returne hereof into my Secretarys Office & for so doing this shall be thy sufficient Warrt Given under my hand & Seal at Chester this 25<sup>th</sup> of ye 10<sup>th</sup> Month 1682.
