

Situate in the County of Chester
 By Virtue of a Warrant from the Commiss^{rs} of Property bearing date the 23^d of the 6th month 1703 for surveying unto Joseph Brown Attorney for Susanna Cadman Six hundred and twenty five Acres of Land in this Province in right of Charles and Grace Bathurst their original purchase of twelve hundred and fifty Acres since purchased of the said Grace by the said Susanna.—

Survey'd and laid out the said Quantity of Six hundred and twenty five Acres [±] beginning at a post at the corner of another tract of land belonging to the said Susanna Cadman thence West by the line of the said Cadman's land two hundred and twenty nine perches to White Oak thence south four hundred and fifty seven perches to a post thence east two hundred and twenty nine perches to a post in the line of the London Company's Land thence North by the line of the said London Company's Land four hundred and fifty seven perches to the place of beginning. Cont^d 625 Acres.
