At the Request of William Cloud jun^t of Concord in Chester County that we would grant him to take up among the late Surveys made back in the said County the quantity of three hundred acres of land for which he agrees to pay to the Proprietary Trustees use Thirty pounds Money of Pensylvania for the whole and the yearly quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for each hundred acres. These are to authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said William Cloud back in the said County according to the method of Townships appointed the said quantity of three hundred acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretary's Office which Survey in case the said William fulfill the above agreement within three months after the date hereof shall be valid Otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted.
