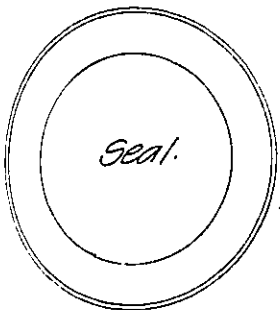


Pensylvania G.



By the Commissioners of Property

At the Request of Hugh Davies that we would grant him to take up fifty Acres of Land Promised him by the Proprietor when he came into this Province a Servant in the year 1699 to be held under the usual Rent of Servants Land Viz one half penny Sterl. P. Acre as also that we would suffer him to take up other fifty acres together with the first to be purchased within two months after Survey according to its Value in ye place where it shall be laid out: These are to authorize & Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd to the said Hugh Davies the said fifty acres of headland in some Vacant place in the Upper part of the Welch Tract or other vacancy that has not been already Survey'd nor taken up as also to lay out other fifty acres contiguous adjoining to the same and make Returns of the whole Hundred together into the Secretaries Office. Given under Our hands and Seal of the Province at Philad^{ia} the 20th day of ye 4th moth (June) 1712
