to survey or cause to be Survey'd unto him ye said number of Acres where  
not taken up already according to ye method of Townships appointed by me  
& make return thereof into my Secretary's Office. Given at Philadelphia ye  
9<sup>th</sup> of ye 12<sup>th</sup> Mo. 1682.
