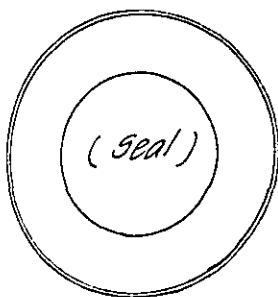


Pennsylvania p.



By the Commissioners of Property.

At the Request of John Evans of Haverford that we would grant him to take up One Hundred Acres of Vacant Land beyond Brandywine in Chester County lying between the settlements of Abiah Taylor James Thomas and Lewellin Parry for which he agrees to pay to the Proprietors Use (besides the yearly Quitrent of One Shilling Sterling forever) Twelve pounds ten shillings Money of this Province unless the Surveyor after his having view'd it shall certify under his hand that it is considerably inferior in Value to the lands lately sold in those parts at that rate, in which case he is to pay ten pounds only: These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said John Evans according to the Method of Townships appointed the said quantity of one hundred Acres of Vacant Land in the place aforesaid and make a Return thereof into the Secretaries Office. Which Survey in case the sd John shall within three months after Survey fulfill ye said agreement shall be valid Otherwise the same is to be void and of no other effect than as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted. Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province atid Philad^{ia} the 26th day of the first month A.D. 1716.
