These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said Leonard Streipers the said quantity of one hundred Acres of Land in the Said Mann^r: Joyning to the Land of Edward Farmer and y^e German Tract And make a Returne there of into the Secretar^ys Office in Order to a further Confirmation. which Survey in Case the said Leonard fulfill the above agreement at the Location, shall be Valid. Otherwise the Same is to be Void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever Granted, Given under our hands and Seale of the Province at Philadelphia the 5th day of the fourth Month Anno Din. 1714.
