Which Not being exicuted but Conveyed to Ebinazer Large by the Widow of the Said John Davis, by a Certain Deeds ~~of~~ Lease & Release dat^d. 16th & 17th 7^{br} 1720. In persueance Thereof this 11th day of 8 month 1726. Surveyed and Laid out to Ebinazer Large afforesaid, this Tract of Land. Begining at a post near a White Oak Tree In the line of John Chapmans Land, Thence Extending by the said John Chapmans ~~land~~ and Vacant Land North West 132 perches to a post. Than by Vacant land North East 86 perches to a post. Than by Mathew Hughes and Vacant land 183 perches to a post. Than by Vacant land South West 88 perches to a smal hycory. Than by Vacant - South East 51 perches. Than by Vacant - South West 257 perches to a post. Than by Alex^{der} and Thomas Browns Land South East 296 perche to a post. Than by Ephram Fentons Land North East Nineteen perches to a stone, Than by Francis Houghs Land North West 32 perches to a post. Than by the s^d houghs Land Two hundred and forty perches, to the first Mentioned Place of Begining. Containing five hundred Acres. And Six Acres to the hundred Added Lyeing In Plumstead Township.
