then Laid out and surveied for William Smith one tract of Land Lieng on the west side of the Scoole Creek. Containeng 250 Acres begining at A marked red oak standing near the 5^d Creek by a run Called Snake run. from thence runing west into the woods 670 pertches to A marked white oak standing near A brantch by a line of marked trees: and from the 5^d white oak runing south east and by east 160 pertches to A marked red oak by A Line of marked trees; and from the 5^d red oak runing east by William Powells Line of marked trees 670 pertches to the 5^d Powells marked Corner red oak standing by the Scoole Creek side. And from thence one severall Corses by the 5^d Creek side unto the first marked Corner red oak.
