



By Virtue of a War<sup>t</sup> from the Commissioners of Property Dated  
 the — Day of — Surveyed and laid out for John Sickfred a Tract  
 of land situate in Maxatawny in the County of Philad<sup>a</sup> begining  
 at a large black oak a Corner of Casper Wister's land, thence by  
 the same North Eighty Degrees East One hundred Eighty three  
 perches and the same Course by Vacant land Two hundred & Sev-  
 en perches to a post, thence by Vacant land <sup>North Ten Degrees west</sup> One hundred and thirty  
 perches to a post, thence by Vacant land <sup>S. Eighty west</sup> three hundred and Nin-  
 ety perches to a Small white oak Saplin-Mark<sup>t</sup> for a Corner, thence  
 by land of Nicholas Cout South Ten Degrees East to the place  
 of begining. Containing Three hundred acres with allowance  
 of Six & Cent.
