(Seal Missing) (obl.) ere as in or about the Year of our Lord 1703 there was Survey'd & Confirmed to Hannah Price (obl.) Executrix of the last Will & Testament of Thomas Musgrove Deceased the Quantity of five Hundred (obl.) es of Land joyning on the line of the German Companys Land in the County of Philadelphia then (obl.) used to be Vacant & clear of other claims. But as it now appears upon a late resurvey the greater part of (obl.) aid five hundred Acres is ^{supposed to be} within the lines of the said German Companys Land. And Whereas the Right to the said five hundred Acres being now Vested in Nicholas Scull of the City of Philad^a who by means of the priority of Survey of the s^d German Company's Land cannot hold the s^d five hundred Acres as the same is now located. He therefore requests that he may be permitted to Surrender & Release the Said Location and to take up the like Quantity where it may be found Vacant in the s^d County. These are therefore to Authorize & Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the s^d Nicholas Scull within the s^d County of Philad^a according to the Method of Townships appointed the s^d quantity of five Hundred Acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretarys Office in Order for a further Confirmation. Given under our Hands & the lesser Seal of the Province at Philad^a the 5th day of December Anno Din. 1727.
