I hereby Certifie into his office that I have Resurveyd and Laide out unto James Sansome a Certain tract of Land in the Township of Abington in the County of Philadelphia, and is Severally divided as may be seen in the figure; Beginning att a stake divideing it from Sillas Crispins Land Land, from thence N.E. 238 per. by an old Line of marked trees, to a post set in the ground, from thence N.E. 142 per.  $\frac{2}{19}$  to another post in the ground by an old Line of marked trees, from thence N.E. 126 per<sup>es</sup> to a Corner post set in the ground by an old Line of marked trees, from that Corner S.E. 152. by an old Line of marked trees to another Corner post set in the ground. from thence S.W. 126 per<sup>es</sup> by an old Line of marked trees to a stake set in the ground, from thence S.W. 142 per<sup>es</sup>  $\frac{2}{19}$  by an old Line of marked trees to post set in the ground, from thence S.W. 238 per<sup>es</sup> by an old Line of marked trees to a Corner post set in the ground, from thence N.W. 152 per<sup>es</sup> by an old Line of marked trees to the place of Beginning Containing in the whole 480 acres and 128 per.
