



In Pursuance of a Warrant from the Commissioners of Property Dated the 18th Day of November 1713 there was Survey'd and Laid out to William Marsh of the County of Chester a Certain Tract of Land in the Township of Sadberry in the said County. Beginning a- Black Oak Marked at a Corner of William Grimson's Land. Thence Run (obl) ing North by the same two hundred and forty perches to a post. Thence West by South by a Line of Marked trees two hundred and Sixteen pches to a post. Then South by William Brintons Land two hundred and forty perches (obl) to a Black Oak. Then East by North two hundred and Sixteen pches to the place of Beginning. Containing Three hundred acres with the usual allowance. Survey'd the (obl) 1st Day of April 1714
