By vertue of a warrant from ye Com<sup>rs</sup> dated ye 15 of ye 12<sup>th</sup> Mo 168<sup>9</sup> directed to the Survey<sup>r</sup> Generall. I do by Authority from him Certifie into ye Secretarys Office that there was Surveyed and Laid out ye same day unto John Streepers Purchas<sup>r</sup> his Lott of Land in ye Libertyes of Philadelphia. Begining at a Corn<sup>r</sup> post of Jacob Telnors Land. from thence N.N.W. by ye same one hundred thirty four perches. from thence W.S.W. by ye Garman Town Ship six perches, from thence S.S.E. by a line of trees one hundred thirty four perches, from thence E.N.E. by a line of trees sixty perches to ye place of begining. Containing Fifty acres of Land, which is accordingly Entred and Recorded in ye Survey<sup>r</sup> Generalls Office at Philadelphia ye 23<sup>d</sup> 2<sup>mo</sup> 1692.
