

Beginning at a Corner Post standing by the River Delaware thence North Seventy Degrees Westerly by the remaining part of Wicaco Land, three hundred forty three perches to a Corner post standing in the said Edward Shippens Line, thence North eleven degrees Easterly fifteen perches to a Corner post standing by the Street of Philadelphia called — Street, thence South Seventy five Degrees Easterly by the same street fifty six perches, thence South Seventy one Degrees Easterly one hundred and Twenty perches, thence South Seventy seven Degrees Easterly one hundred thirty four perches to a Corner post of James Thomas's Land, thence South thirteen Degrees Westerly thirteen perches, thence South Seventy seven Degrees Easterly twenty seven perches to a Corner post standing by the River Delaware, thence along the several Courses thereof to the place of Beginning. Containing and laid out for fifty Acres of Land.
