


Pensilvania } By the Commissioners of Property.

 Whereas Edward Shippen having obtained a Grant from the former Commissioners of Property of one whole Square or a Tract of Ground bounded with four streets within the Bounds of the City Philadelphia for a Pasture under the Yearly Quittrent of five shillings p<sup>annum</sup>. Which Grant the Said Edward offering to Relinquish, hath requested in lieu thereof all that vacant piece of a Square bounded Eastward with the Third Street, Westward with the fourth Street from Delaware, Southward with Spruce Street and Northward with the Backs of Walnut Street Lotts for the Space of fifty one Years, for w<sup>ch</sup> he hath agreed to pay fifteen Shillings of Money of this Province as a yearly Rent for ye Same during the s<sup>d</sup> time, and at the expiration thereof to leave the same well cleared and Improved with English Grass.

These therefore are to require thee forthwith to Survey and lay out to the said Edward Shippen the Said Vacant piece of Ground bounded and Limited as above said and make Returns thereof into the Surveyors Office, where this Warr<sup>t</sup> is to remain, and a Copy thereof attested by the Secret<sup>ry</sup> to be transmitted to thee, who is to take a Duplicate of thy Return into his Office. Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philad<sup>ia</sup> the 2<sup>d</sup> of ye 12<sup>th</sup> Mo<sup>th</sup> 1701.
