



By Virtue of a Warrant dated the 10th day of the 4th Month 1725. I have Surveyed unto the Heirs of William Passmore a Tract of Land situate in ^{Blockley Township in} the Liberties of ~~the~~ ~~City of~~ Philadelphia. Appurtenant to the Original Purchase of 1000 acres made of the late Proprietory by Richard Webb of Kingston upon Thames, and of 250 acres the Original purchase of William Bryan & John Wisdom, and also of and belonging to the Original Purchase of 500 Acres made of the said Proprietor by William Smith of Bristol. Brazier. Beginning at a marked Hickery, a corner of Charles Allen's Land and from thence extending by the same North eighty-six degrees East forty one perches and a half to a Post. thence by Land belonging to the Heirs of ~~the~~ — Carpenter North four Degrees West ten perches and two tenths of a perch to a post. and North eighty six degrees East Fifty perches to a post. thence by Land of James Jones and Lewis Jones North Twenty eight degrees West. Eighty five perches and three tenths of a perch to a post. thence by a line of marked trees. South Sixty three Degrees West Sixty one perches and nine tenths of a perch to a post. thence by Joseph Pike's Land South two degrees East Sixty three perches & nine tenths of a perch to the place of Beginning. Containing Thirty four Acres and one quarter of an Acre.
