



Pursuant to a Warrant from the Commissioners of Property bearing Date the 7<sup>th</sup> of the 2<sup>d</sup> Month 1714. There was Survey'd unto Thomas Andrews on the 13<sup>th</sup> of the 3<sup>d</sup> Month 1715 a Tract of Land at Peequea- in the County of Chester. Containing two hundred and fifty acres being the Original Purchase of Enoch Flower Who Granted the same to W<sup>m</sup> Player and the said Player conveyd the same to the sd Thomas Andrews the said Tract. Beginning at a Black Oak in the Bounds of James Logan's Land and Running by James Clansons Land North West by North four hundred pches to a Post. Then North East One hund<sup>d</sup> and two pches to Marked Black Oak. Then South East by South by Joseph Jarvis's Land four hundred perches to a Post. Then South West by the said James Logan's Land One hundred and two perches to the Beginning.
