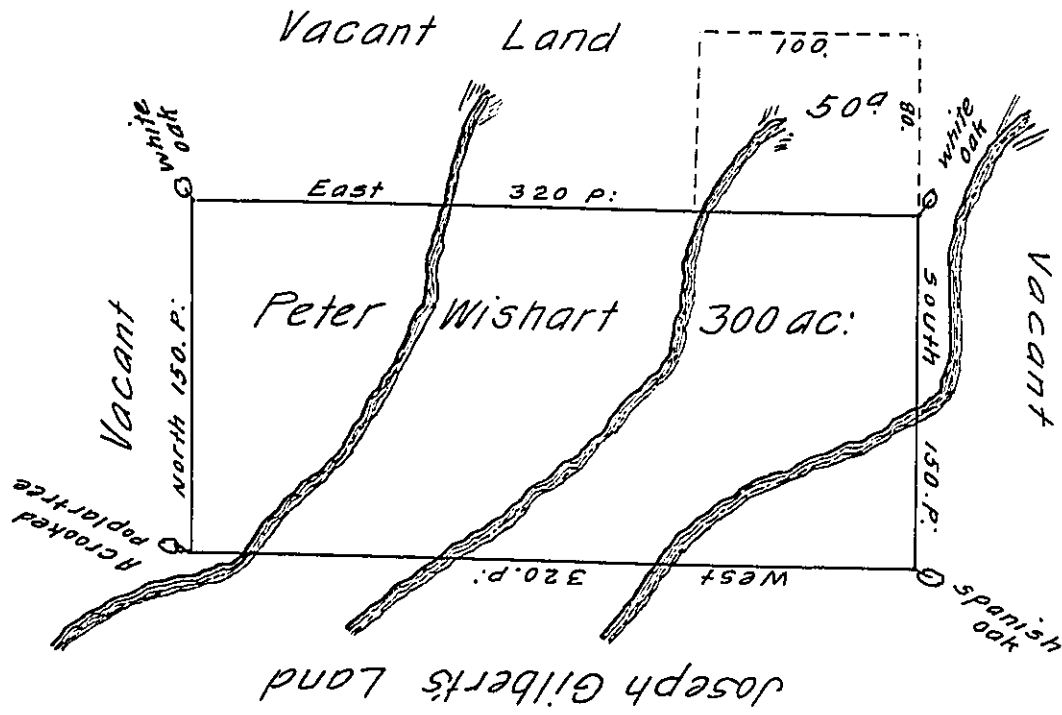


Memorandum the Nineteenth day of April 1749 upon a full Hearing before his Honour the Governor upon a



By virtue of a Warrant from the Commission<sup>rs</sup> of Property bearing date the 6<sup>th</sup> day of the 2<sup>d</sup> month 1715 Surveyed & Laid out unto Peter Wishart a tract of Land in the great Swamp in Bucks County. Begining at a Spanish oak at Joseph Gilbert's Corner, from thence runing West by the sd Gilbert's Line three hundred & twenty pches to a Crooked Poplar tree, Then North by Vacant Land one hundred & fifty perches to a white oak. Then East by Vacant Land three hundred and twenty perches to a white oak, Then by Vacant—South one hundred & fifty perches to the begining. Containing three hundred acres, Laid out by the Survey<sup>r</sup> Gen<sup>l</sup> order the 29<sup>th</sup> / 2<sup>d</sup> / mo. 1716.
