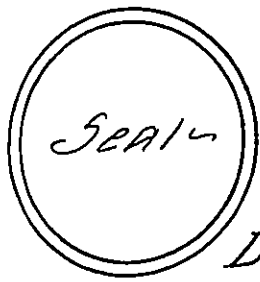


Pensilvania. 5. 5.



By the Commissioners of Property.  
 At the Request of Thomas Lower of London  
 Doctor of Physick by his friend David Lloyd  
 that we would Grant him to take up Twelve hundred  
 and thirty acres of Land [the Liberty Land being al-  
 ready laid out the Original purchase of George Fox  
 made of the Proprietr. by Deeds of Lease and Release  
 dated ye 21<sup>st.</sup> & 22<sup>d.</sup> dayes of October 1681. and is now  
 vested in the Said Thomas Lower These are to Authorize  
 And Require thee to Survey or cause to be Surveyd  
 unto the said Thomas Lower in the aforesaid Right  
 according to the Method of Townships appointed in this  
 Province the Said quantity of Twelve hundred and thirty  
 Acres of Land that has not been already Surveyd nor  
 appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make  
 Returns thereof into the Secretary's Office in Order for  
 a further Confirmation Given under our hands and Seal  
 of the Province at Philadelphia the 22<sup>d.</sup> day of November.  
 Anno Dni. 1717.
