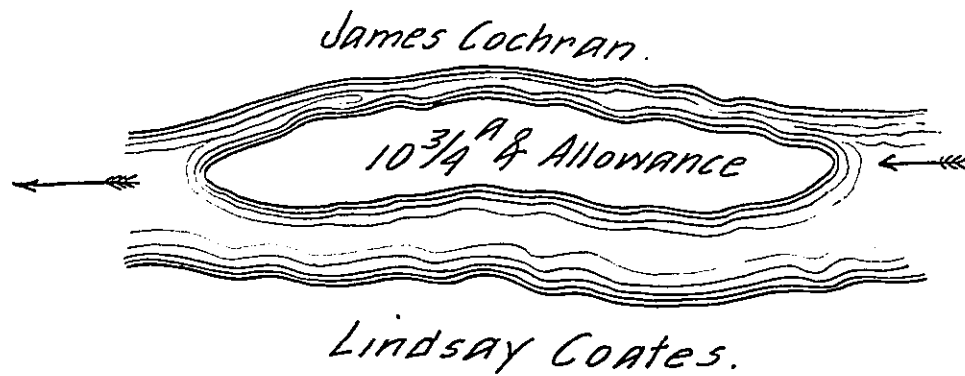

By virtue of a Warrant dated the 29th. day of November
1768 Surveyed the 20th day of July 1776 unto the Honorable

the Lands of James Cochran and Lindsay Coates.
Containing Ten Acres and three quarters and Allowance
of Six p Cent & ca.
