The said Toby Leech took up three hundred acres which was Surveyed and Laid out the 30<sup>th</sup>. of the 9<sup>mo</sup>. 1682. by vertue of a warrant from the Commissrs. dated the tenth of the same month and year of this 300<sup>a</sup>. he sold one hundred ~~he~~ and two hundred acres he bought of George Shoemaker [laid out to Richd. Wain hence he holds four hundred and fifty acres and the overplus he has now bought of the Commissrs of Property.
